Transracial Adoption Study

The University of Maryland's Department of Family Science, in conjunction with The Center for Adoption Support and Education (CASE), are initiating a national survey of transracially adopted adolescents and their families. **We are currently looking for participants for this important research project.**

The specific focus of the study is to examine the impact of family characteristics on the overall adjustment, self-esteem and racial identity of racial minority youth adopted by white parents. Who can participate?

If the parent or parents in your family are white and there is a least one racial minority adolescent (currently aged 14-18) who was adopted by the age of 3, you may qualify to participate.

What will I be asked to do?

Both parent and child will be asked to complete an on-line survey that will take approximately 20 minutes. Upon completion, participating adolescents will receive a \$10 iTunes gift card (some restrictions apply).
